Sussex Men at Agincourt 1415

Although a cross Sussex list this is specific to the retinue of Lord Camoys who is reported to have led the left wing of Henry V's army. It is noted that the future lord of Hasting Rape, Thomas Hoo, is prominent. (From Dawson).

Sir Roger Fiennes of Herstmonceux was also present, probably in Henry V's central troop, and provided seven men-at-arms and 24 archers. He took two prisoners who were ransomed for £55 11s 4d.
